Fluconazole (Diflucan)

Indication(s): Topical Fungal Infections

Contraindications: Hypersensitivity to fluconazole.

Precautions: Do not use during pregnancy unless benefit outweighs the potential risk to the fetus as there is increased risk of spontaneous abortion and congenital abnormalities, particularly in the 1st trimester.

Drug Interactions: ↑ benzodiazepine conc (midazolam); HCTZ ↑ fluconazole conc; Reports of QT Prolongation – Azole class effect – Review patient's current pharmacotherapy and comorbidities (cardiac) before supplying.

Adverse effects: Headache (12.9%); Nausea (6.7%); Abdominal pain (5.6%); Diarrhea (2.7%); Dyspepsia (1.3%); Dizziness (1.3%); Taste perversion (1.3%). Rarely, angioedema and anaphylactic reaction have been reported. (< 1%) Occasional allergic reactions including pruritus and urticaria.

Pharmacology: Inhibits fungal sterol synthesis which detrimentally alters the fungal cell membrane. Increased membrane permeability results in growth inhibition and cell death. T1/2 ~ 30hr (range: 20-50hr) after oral administration.

Administration and dosage: 150mg PO once weekly X 4 weeks for a fungal skin infection that is too extensive for topical treatment.
