Sulfamethoxazole – Trimethoprim (Septra)

Indication(s): Cellulitis Protocol (Suspected MRSA)

Contraindications: Hypersensitivity to Septra, its components or "Sulfa" Drugs. **Precautions:** Septra should be avoided in pregnancy unless benefit to mother outweighs risk to fetus.

Drug Interactions: Cyclosporine or Methotrexate - \downarrow conc of immunosuppressant (consider sub ABX). Concomitant use of trimethoprim with digoxin has been shown to increase plasma digoxin levels in a proportion of elderly patient (Monitor).

Adverse Effects: (>1%) Nausea; vomiting; diarrhea; rash; urticaria; headache; anorexia, hyperkalemia. (≤1%) Light-headedness; dizziness, vertigo, ataxia, drowsiness; fatigue; candidiasis; vaginitis; chills & myalgia; hypotension; QTprolongation; hypoglycemia; rhabdomyolysis; diuresis.

Pharmacology: Inhibition of bacterial folic acid pathway/thymidine nucleotide synthesis.

Dosage and Administration: Septra DS – 2 Tabs PO BID for 10 days.
